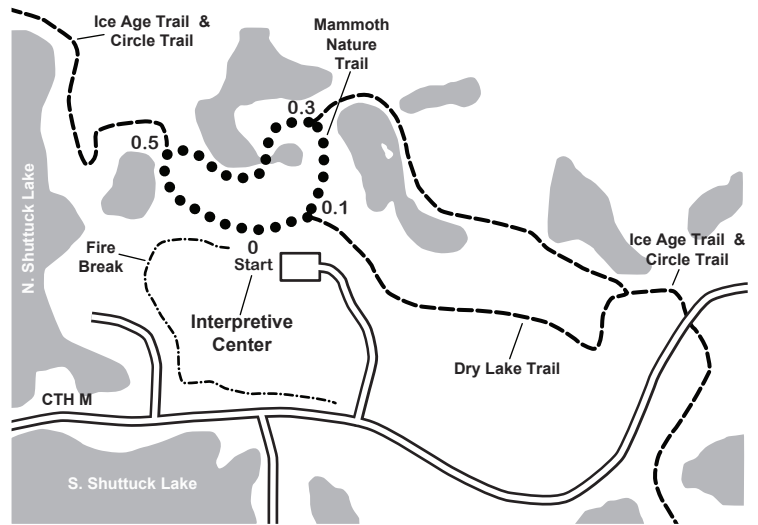


# Mammoth Nature Trail

## 0.7-mile loop

**0 miles.** Start at the Interpretive Center. Read the “Welcome to the Woolly Mammoth Trail” sign at the trail head. Follow the combined Ice Age Trail, Circle Trail, Dry Lake Trail, and Mammoth Nature Trail to the right.



**0.1 mile.** Stop here and read the sign about Ice-walled-lake plains. At the intersection, turn left on the combined Ice Age Trail, Circle Trail and Mammoth Nature Trail. Between here and the next intersection, you will also be able to read signs about “Hummocks and Kettles” and “Perched Lakes.”

**0.2 mile.** Stop here and read the sign about the Logging Sledway. At the intersection turn left on the combined Dry Lake Trail and Mammoth Nature Trail. If you decide to go out on the foot bridge, remember you have left the Mammoth Nature Trail to do so. You will need to turn around and then continue straight past the intersection to complete the loop. On your way to the next intersection, read the sign about the “Myriad of Lakes.”

**0.5 mile.** At the intersection turn left on the combined Ice Age Trail, Circle Trail, Dry Lake Trail and Mammoth Nature Trail. Returning toward the Interpretive Center, you may read signs titled “Long Distance Hitchhikers” and “Take Time for the Ice Age.”

**0.7 mile.** Interpretive Center. End of trail.
